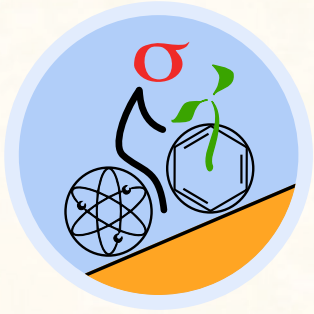

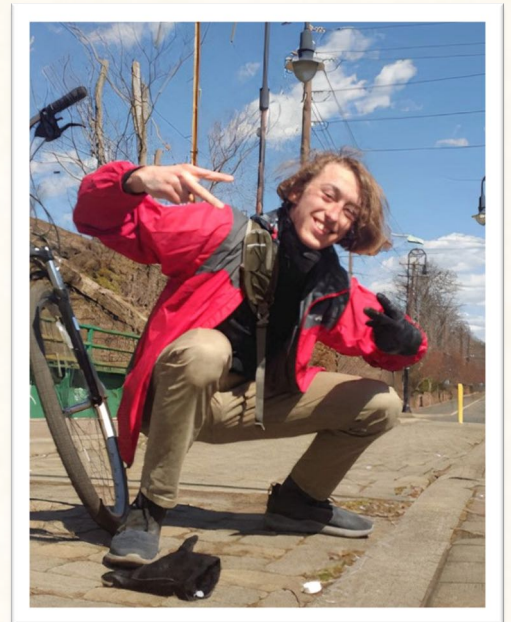

When Will Robots Learn To Speak Our Language?
